<u>Does your child struggle with:</u> Poor listening/attention, poor auditory memory, misunderstanding of verbal information, overwhelmed by environmental distractions, inability to follow verbal directions, over or under sensitivity to certain sounds, poor sequencing skills, poor motor coordination or processing delays.

<u>How does Auditory Integration Training help</u>? Distortions in hearing perception and reduced middle ear function can be a significant contributing factor in the above conditions. These distortions can include hearing that is disorganized, erratic, asymmetrical, hypersensitive, or otherwise abnormal. Berard AIT sound training was designed to 'normalize' hearing by changing the way the brain and auditory system process information.
